

Primary and Secondary students are challenged to research and create eco-friendly wearable art.


- Students can work as individuals or groups to create garments in response to the theme, Incredible Kai.
- Garments are modelled and judged at Vodafone Events Centre in a one-night Fashion Show in front of a live audience.
- In 2021, there were 93 entries from 13 schools across Auckland






Sustainable Fashion/ Art NAT

Key things for students to consider throughout the project:

- 1. Where will my garment end up when I am finished with it?
- 2. How could I use the materials again?

Top tip: A design journal helps us understand the journey and learning.

Eye on Nature Fashion Design Project - What to expect.









- First place \$1000
- Second place \$500
- Third place \$250
- Merit award \$100
- What your students need to start their project: workspace/equipment/materials & storage.
- Students will need to plan time commitments
- Teacher commitments supervision is essential at the dress rehearsal afternoon and show night. Required to keep student on-track and ensure necessary entry forms are submitted on time.






Judging criteria/weightings

- Interpretation (20%)
- Materials (20%)
- Designer Statement (15%)
- Originality and Innovation (15%)
- Construction (15%)
- Artist Effort (15%)

Panel of 3x judges who will assess each entry against the criteria to decide the award-winning garments

- We will offer in-school workshops during term two of 2022










Free workshops

- Chance to understand sustainability, ask us questions and opportunity for students to show their design/research process/progress.
- In-school workshops available for students learning about the 'Incredible Kai' theme.
- We can offer flexible timing, roughly 60-90 minutes long. 20 minute presentation then an interactive activity and display of their work.
- Workshops may be filmed/photographed to showcase during the runway show.

What to expect for the show?







It will be required to attend the Dress Rehearsal on Wed 22 June, 12:30pm – 2:30pm. A programme will be sent out closer to the time.

This day is necessary to:


- Run through sign in and backstage procedures
- Test stage lighting and tech
- Ensure the models know their place in the line up and familiarise themselves with changing and waiting rooms
- Help calm nerves
- Garments and statements will be judged during the dress rehearsal

Please note only models (plus one helper each) will be allowed backstage. Other students/parents can watch the rehearsal in the Theatre.











Fashion Show 23 June 2022, 6:30-9:00pm



- Models and helpers can arrive from 3:30pm to sign in and get changed into garments backstage.
- Everyone else will need to purchase tickets ahead of time to enjoy the show. Tickets usually sell out, so please ensure your parents secure theirs early.
- Options to cover ticket costs for families with financial barriers
- Doors open at 6pm and show runs from 6:30pm 9pm with prize giving from 8:30pm.
- Please arrange for a place for parents to meet the models after the show is finished as they will need to stay backstage for the entire show.
- Please ensure the garments are taken home afterwards.




Commitment to delivering Wearable Arts
