Eye on Nature Wearable Arts



Wednesday 21 & Thursday 22 June 2023 **Due Drop Events Centre**

In this annual competition, students are challenged to create eco-friendly wearable art. As well as originality and effort, the creations are judged on the interpretation of the theme, use of sustainable materials, creative repurposing of waste materials and the impact the garments have on the environment.

The garments are judged and \$3,500 in prizes are awarded at the Eye on Nature Wearable Arts Fashion Show. Students get the exhilarating experience of modelling their eco-friendly creations on a professional fashion runway in front of a live audience.

Adopt a Park



Schools take ownership of their local park In partnership with Auckland Council Parks, delivers conservation activities to primary and secondary school ākonga through place-based learning.

With our team, tamariki and rangatahi learn through interactive experiences on site and participate in environmental activities such as planting, animal pest monitoring, identification and eradication of pest weeds, collecting litter and water quality monitoring.

Schools are encouraged to engage with this programme throughout the school year, offering great opportunities to learn about seasonal environmental indicators.






Creator Space

Conservation Workshops





In partnership with Papakura and Manurewa Local Boards, we work with schools and community groups to make South Auckland pest free by 2050. Through learning how to monitor and trap animal pests, schools are helping to tackle environmental threats and regenerate natural spaces.

We facilitate conservation workshops in the classroom and out in the field. Ākonga learn about taonga species and conservation in a way that's tailored to their age group, combining theoretical knowledge with practical skills.

Graffiti Prevention & Murals







We hold in-school workshops for tamariki and rangatahi, exploring what graffiti vandalism is, why it happens, how it impacts their community and how they can help prevent it.

As part of our education programme, we also work with schools to create their own beautiful community murals. Collaborating with local artists, students work together to create their own artwork concepts and bring them to life. Our mural programme helps channel creative expression in a positive way, while giving students a sense of pride and belonging in their community.

Interactive climate and zero waste education workshops


